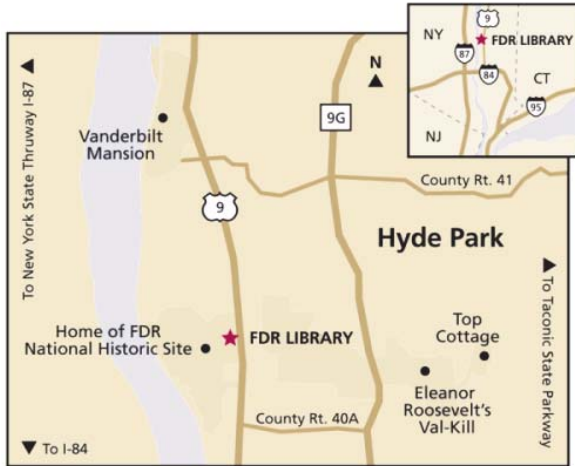


**HRWA 2011 Conference location:**

**From the South:** Take I-84 to Route 9 north. Wallace Center at the Roosevelt Library is on the left (west) side of Route 9, 4 miles north of Poughkeepsie.  
**From the East:** Take Route 55 west through Poughkeepsie, then Route 9 north per directions above.  
**From the North—East of the Hudson River:** South on Route 9. The Library is on the right, 2 miles south of the Vanderbilt Mansion in Hyde Park.  
**From the North—West of the Hudson River:** Take the New York State Thruway (I-87) south to exit 18 at New Paltz. Follow Route 299 east to Route 9W south. Cross the Mid-Hudson Bridge to Route 9 north. The Roosevelt Library is on the left (west) side of Route 9, 4 miles north of Poughkeepsie.  
**By Train:** Metro-North Railroad - Daily from Grand Central Terminal to Poughkeepsie on the Hudson Line. Taxi service available from Poughkeepsie.

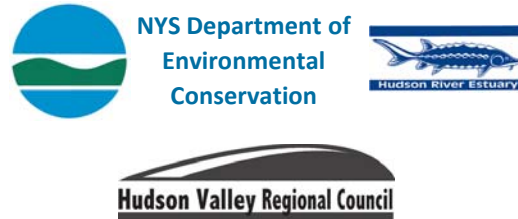

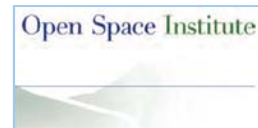
